

# **Research Question and Thesis**

How do the Proud Boys justify political violence towards those with differing political ideologies?

They justify their violence by framing it as a response to <u>attacks by the left</u> and do so as an <u>embodiment of their nostalgic views of manhood</u>.

## Political Violence as a 'Defense'

- Identity as Defenders
  - Protect McInnes and Stone
- Rhetoric of Gavin McInnes
  - Proud Boys were "left to fight" after bottle thrown at them by leftist protestors
  - Under attack by a "left wing city that hates them" in NYC
  - "people now are [like] crazy ex-girlfriends"
- Online

# Utilizing Nostalgia to Justify their 'Defense'

- Praise traditional gender roles
  - "Venerate the housewife"
  - Traditional Libertarian and protective man
  - Mirrored in online imagery


## **Theories Behind Actions**

#### Social Cognition

- Unfair social deprivation → demonize the left
- Leftists responsible for loss of conservative values
- Humiliation-Revenge Theory
  - → Humiliated by leftist attacks → fight back
  - Prevent further humiliation from ingroup

#### Moral Superiority

- o Victims of the political left
- Sacrifice themselves by fighting

## Their Political Violence is *Not* Terrorism

 "[terrorism] perpetrated by individuals and/or groups inspired by or associated with primarily U.S.-based movements that espouse <u>extremist</u> ideologies of a political, religious, social, racial, or environmental nature" - FBI  "the threat or use of violence against <u>non-combatants</u> to instill fear and influence an opponent in pursuance of a political goal" Alexander Clayton

## **Next Course of Action**

- Policymakers need to use their platform to advocate for greater nonviolence in public protesting.
  - Nonviolent resistance is more effective
  - e.g. Donald Trump & Bernie Sanders
  - Can't "defend" yourself if there is no attack
