# Summer 2015: New Faculty Faces in IER/IE



### Claire Brunel

Prof. Brunel recently completed the requirements for the PhD in Economics at <u>Georgetown University</u>. Her research focuses on policy-relevant issues at the intersection of international trade and environmental economics.

She is particularly interested in providing empirical evidence of the links between environmental policies and international competitiveness. For example, she asks whether policies that encouraged the use and the development of renewable energies in the OECD led to an increase in domestic innovation and manufacturing, or rather to a rise in the licensing and importing of foreign technologies. Other works examine the role of the offshoring of polluting industries in emissions reductions of EU and US manufacturing and how to measure the stringency of environmental policies. Current works in progress study subsidies of solar panels, the co-benefits of environmental regulation in the US, and the trade diversification patterns of developing countries.

Prior to starting her PhD and during her studies, Prof. Brunel worked at the <u>Peterson Institute</u> for International Economics, the Research Department of the <u>World Bank</u>, and as Trade Policy Attaché at the <u>Embassy of France</u> in Washington DC. She obtained an MPhil in Economics from <u>Oxford University</u> and a B.Sc. in Mathematics and Economics from <u>Georgetown</u> <u>University</u>. Prof. Brunel will be teaching SIS-616 "International Economics" and SIS-620 "Introduction to Environmental Economics."



## Jennifer Poole

Prof. Poole served until recently as Senior International Economist at the White House's<u>Council</u> of Economic Advisers. She was on leave from her position as Assistant Professor in the Department of Economics, and as an affiliated faculty member in the Department of Latin American and Latino Studies, at the <u>University of California at Santa Cruz</u>. She has also been a Research Fellow at the <u>IZA Institute for the Study of Labor</u>, an independent economic research institute based in Germany focused on the analysis of global labor markets.

She holds a Ph.D. in Economics from the <u>University of California at San Diego</u> and a B.A. in Economics from <u>Smith College</u>. She has previously been employed as an economist by the<u>Federal Reserve Bank of New York</u> and as a consultant by the <u>International Labor</u> <u>Organization</u>, a United Nations agency focused on labor issues. Prof. Poole has also been a visiting scholar at the World Bank, the <u>Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia</u>, the <u>Federal</u> <u>Reserve Bank of San Francisco</u>, the <u>Université Nice Sophia Antipolis</u> (France), and the <u>University of Munich</u>(Germany). Her research and teaching interests fall at the intersection of international trade, labor economics, and development economics. With an emphasis on Brazil, Professor Poole's broad research agenda considers the effects of global integration on local labor markets. In particular, recent work investigates information transfer in international trade and investment and the impact of globalization on employment and wages.

Her research has been published in the Journal of International Economics, the American Economic Review, the Review of Economics and Statistics, and World Development, and

has been funded by the National Science Foundation. Prof. Poole will be teaching SIS-616 "International Economics" and SIS-635 "Introduction to Economic Development."
