When the festival begins, writers are randomly assigned a line that they must include in their play. They then spend the night writing their plays. Once they're done a director and a group of actors is assigned to each play, and they spend the day staging and rehearsing before the performances Saturday night.

This is the second year the AU Players have produced the 24-Hour Play Festival, and they are committed to making it an annual tradition. Tickets are \$5 at the door.
