	Meet with an <u>undergraduate career advisor</u> or attend an <u>AU Career Center</u> workshop to discuss your resume, cover letter, and internship resources	
	Consider an AU Abroad program that has an internship component	
	Attend the fall and spring Job and Internship Fairs	
	Consider doing a mock interview with your SIS undergraduate career advisor	
	Create and maintain a LinkedIn profile and have it reviewed by your career advisor	
	Craft your "Elevator Pitch"

	Identify and join professional associations that are related to your career interest	
	Participate in the on-campus Job and Internship Fair	
	Consider job shadowing and/or volunteer and community service opportunities	
	Attend networking events for your professional development

	Apply for peer mentoring/peer educator/peer advising programs on campus	
	Expand your leadership role in an organization

	Review your Degree Audit Report and check that all graduation requirements have been met	
	Apply to graduate on Eagle Service by the published deadline

	Meet with an <u>undergraduate career advisor</u> to develop an independent job search and update your resume, or to discuss	
	graduate school applications and personal statements	
	Schedule a mock interview with your career advisor	
	Attend all career-related workshops, information sessions, and panels hosted by the SIS Office of Career Development	
	Expand your network and interview with professionals in the industries, locations, and companies that interest you by	
	attending Job and Internship Fair
